The LORD is Our Healer


Exodus 15:1

¹Then Moses and the people of Israel sang this song to the LORD, saying,


“I will sing to the LORD, for he has triumphed gloriously; the horse and his rider he has thrown into the sea.

**²The LORD is my strength and my song,

this is my God, and I will praise him,
my father's God, and I will exalt him.**

by your strength to your holy abode.**


**14The peoples have heard; they tremble;


And I am sure of this, that He who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ.

21And Miriam sang to them:


“Sing to the LORD, for he has triumphed gloriously; the horse and his rider he has thrown into the sea.”
