

7“You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain, for the LORD will not hold him guiltless who takes his name in vain.




Jeremiah 6:13-14




For we who have believed enter that rest...So then, there remains a Sabbath rest for the people of God, for whoever has entered God's rest has also rested from his works as God did from his.
